





President Steve thanked DG Nalani for getting him an Uber ride in Atlanta. Jade Powers brought a guest to the meeting.

AG Mary Ann Berry introduced our speaker: District Governor Nalani Flynn. AG Mary Ann said that DG Nalani has been a credit union executive. She has been President of the Waianae Coast Rotary Club twice. She was an AG for five years and she was instrumental in organizing the Rotary Peace Forum.

DG Nalani began by telling us this would be the fasted **DG** speech ever. She thanked us for the invitation and said it was her honor to serve us as **District Governor**. She became a Rotarian after she was a victim of a robbery. After the robbery, she was given a new position in charge of marketing because she new all about the credit union. Her boss was a Rotarian, who invited her to join. She asked her son what Rotary was and was told that it was a bunch of old white guys who wrote checks. At her first Rotary International meeting, she learned about how Rotary was building water wells. This was her aha moment. She went back to her club and told them that she knew her purpose: To help Waianae, the homeless, and the dysfunctional children

in the area. She needed to give back. Her first project was the Dictionary Project. She told one of the students to be sure and sign his dictionary. She asked if he had dictionaries at home. Another student said he did not have a home. He lived on the beach. DG Nalani pointed out a library to the student and said he could borrow books there and travel the world. As Rotarians, we foster literacy and serve as mentors for others. Forty years ago, Rotary invited women to join Rotary! She is the first DG with Hawaiian decent. After her installation, she received a note from someone who attended. The note told her that the installation was the best four hours the person had experienced lately. The person was impressed with the Rotary family and the person was certain that there was no task too large for DG Nalani to handle.

DG Nalani told us that her husband was diagnosed the stage 4 cancer and was told he had one year to live. PDG Laura Steelquist told her that she saw an invoice for medical supplies and if there was ever anything she needed to let her know. Her husband passed away. She decided to give up her Rotary membership. She then was asked to be an Assistant Governor. She initially said no. Her son told her that her husband had died but she was still alive and she had much to do and needed to do it. DG Nalani thought about the friendships in Rotary and decided to become an AG. She had seen the Four Way Test in action.

When asked what has been her biggest surprise since joining Rotary, she simply said "Being selected to become a **District Governor**.

Everyone sang Happy Birthday to PDG Roy King!!! The ticket for the lucky winner was drawn. PP Dave Livingston was the winner...again! He always gives \$100 to the Rotary Foundation when he wins!

DRAWING CONNECTIONS



Inside the inn's restaurant, Jackie Huie sits at a corner table explaining the student mentoring program that the Rotary Club of St. Joseph & Benton Harbor started a decade ago – a program that has helped more than 400 local high school students learn more about their dream careers by connecting them with professionals in those fields.

The exposure to community service that the program provides has led students to start **Interact clubs** at six local schools, including one at St. Joseph High School that has about 150 members. As the Rotarians work their connections to find mentors for students, they have strengthened the bonds between the 140-member Rotary club and its community. And in small ways, the program is even building bridges between St. Joseph and its "twin city" across the St. Joseph River – Benton Harbor, a once-affluent manufacturing town fallen on hard times.

"I grew up in an entrepreneur family where my father did something I found interesting, and he allowed me to see behind the scenes," says Huie, CEO of JohnsonRauhoff, an ad agency her father built. "I felt very fortunate to be able to do that, and I want that opportunity for others."

Her wavy brown hair is pulled back in a ponytail, and her words come out in a rush: Everything about Huie attests to an intensity that gets results. In 2006, she met with fellow Rotarian Maria Kibler and a few others at Phoenix Rising, a café in the nascent arts district of Benton Harbor, to map out a plan. Kibler was a chaperone in the club's student guest program.

TODAY'S SPEAKER: BRAD COATES



BRADLEY A. COATES is an experienced divorce attorney who has practiced extensively in the Hawaii Family Court system for the last 39 years. A graduate of the University of Southern California and UCLA School of Law, Mr. Coates was the founder and senior partner of Coates & Frey, the largest divorce and family law firm in Hawaii. He now serves as Of Counsel to the firm.

Mr. Coates also founded and administers the low cost divorce mediation clinic "Divorce with Decency". He has been a popular lecturer for decades here in Hawaii on the topics of divorce and family law, analyzing and improving marital relationships, and the "ripple effects" of divorce on families and society. Throughout the last 30 years, Brad was a popular columnist for both the Honolulu News and the Oahu Island News and he appeared regularly on local radio and TV programs. He has also lectured on the both mainland and internationally including over 15 years of traveling to over 100 countries as the featured speaker and "relationships expert" aboard Princess Cruises. Mr. Coates has been named Hawaii's "Best Divorce Lawyer" by the readers of both Honolulu Weekly and Honolulu Magazine. He has also been repeatedly selected as one of Hawaii's SuperLawyers. He estimates that he and the ten attorneys in the Coates & Frey firm have successfully completed nearly thirty thousand divorce cases during the last three plus decades. In 1998, Brad published an award-winning book on the divorce process through the University of Hawaii Press entitled, Divorce with Decency: The Complete How-To Handbook and Survivor's Guide to the Legal, Emotional, Economic, and Social Issues.
